

FROM THE SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR DEACON WAYNE WEILER

Dear Brothers and Sisters of the 4th Day,

Once again, our Christian journey finds us at the beginning of the Blessed and Holy Season of Advent. The weather is getting colder, the trees are bare, and the days are noticeably shorter, and there are obvious signs of change all around us. The new Liturgical Year is another sign of change.

Advent gives us the opportunity to use the stillness and quiet of these weeks before the Incarnation to reflect, pray, and to accept Jesus in our lives in new and amazing ways, while we anticipate and await His return.

But despite our best efforts, the time leading up to Christmas is often filled with business, distractions, and stress. We have our family traditions and gatherings, shopping, baking, wrapping, and yes all those "holiday" parties to attend. So much for the stillness and quiet of Advent, right?

My first action as Lay Director was to attend the Region IV Fall Cursillo Encounter which was held at the Our Lady of the Holy Spirit Center in Cincinnati, OH on 13-15 October. I was pleasantly surprised with the talks and the way the encounter was organized and run. Many of the attendees did not speak English so the talks were conducted in English but simultaneously translated to Spanish for the Hispanic community. The Mass was also conducted in both English and Spanish.

In my term as the Lay Director for the Belleville Diocese, I would like to continue providing great weekends for our candidates and I would like to move ahead with the selection of Parish Representatives for Cursillo which was started by Nick Lang. To be realistic, we are not going to get representatives for all the parishes in the diocese but I would like to start the effort with some of our more active parishes. This will also contribute to a second goal which is to improve the awareness of Cursillo in the Catholic Community. I would like to improve coverage of Cursillo in Diocesan publications and I would like to see more of the 4th-Day community wearing shirts with "Cursillo" or "De Colores" logos. As we like to say, we are <u>not</u> an Organization, we <u>are</u> a Movement. We did <u>not</u> join an organization, but we <u>did</u> set out on our 4th Day Journey, a movement toward Christ with those we encounter. We have no membership dues, no mandatory meetings, no rituals, no ranks or offices, no awards for "Cursillista of the Year."

What we <u>do</u> have, however, is the **Friendship Group**, which gives life to our Movement. Everyone in our Friendship Groups is equal in status, free to speak their minds, and committed to the good of the others in the group. We all have equal responsibility to each other, to Christ and His Church, and to use our time, talent and treasure for the good of those near to us - - and to those far away.

But wait, you might say: What about this "School of Leaders?" Isn't the Secretariat an "Organization?" Don't we have Committees and Chair people who have to go to meetings? Don't we have monthly Ultreyas that someone has to organize and run?

Yes, but these are simply larger "friendship groups," which only exist to encourage and facilitate the forming of Friendships in Christ. In the School of Leaders these past few months, we have been discussing and learning the meaning and effect of "Friendship" in the PreCursillo, Cursillo, and PostCursillo. We have been studying the articles from the National Cursillo website and answering the question of what it means to "make a friend, be a friend, and bring your friend to Christ."

Cursillo is not about adding up numbers of Candidates for the Weekends, it's about developing friendships in Christ. GRAND ULTREYA WITNESS TALK SYNOPSIS OF GARRY RANGE'S PRESENTATION

Here is an edited version of Garry Range's talk. You really had to be there to get the full message and appreciate the deepness of faith given with a light Cursillo touch:

My Name is Garry Range and I began my Cursillo Journey at Belleville Men's Cursillo #32, 1,655 days ago and I sat at the table of St. Matthew.

By the grace of God I humbly stand before you today, a forgiven sinner who is loved by God, to give a sharing, a witness, to what I have seen and know about our God during my Cursillo journey.

Jesus invites us to go on a journey with him with the eyes of faith. St Paul gives us a definition of faith in Hebrews 11:1 "Faith is the substance of things to be hoped for, the evidence of things that appear not." This is where with the grace of God, His Word, and His Church and sacraments through our piety, study and action helps us.

What shirt do you see that I am wearing? Most people will say a baseball St. Louis Cardinals shirt and that I must be a big fan. But with eyes of faith do you not see I am wearing the shirt of a canonized saint of the Catholic Church, St. Louis IX? And, the color red, cardinal red, is associated with the Holy Spirit. This is my re-Confirmation shirt. This shirt is my "Come Holy Spirit" reminder. Brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ, if God can make holy this ordinary shirt, what can he do for each one of us? Yes, He can make scoundrels into saints!

Being a Christian is like riding a bicycle. One can admire the beauty of a bicycle and study everything there is to know on how to ride a bike. One can even join a bicyclist club that meets every weekend. But can one truly call himself a bicyclist without getting on that bike and riding it? With eyes of faith, are we pedaling with the Paraclete? With eyes of faith, this bike I am referring to is a bicycle built for three. We are seated in the middle with the Holy Spirt behind us, urging and encouraging us onward, with Jesus upfront steering!

We live in a most challenging time of human history. In today's world, the world I know and live in, it seems that very few people haven't heard of Jesus, but it does seem quite a few people do not know Jesus. Through eyes of faith, I must see the face of Jesus in every one I meet or know, be him a friend or foe. Through eyes of faith I must also be the witness, that is, the reflection of Jesus in all that I say and do. We must remember, and never forget, every human being, friend or enemy, Christian or not, we are all created out of God's love in the image and likeness of Him and thereby worthy of our love.

One of the many fruits of my Cursillo journey is my prison ministry. As God would have it I was introduced to prison ministry through grouping. I felt a vocation to minister to these men. I am a Volunteer Chaplain at Menard Correctional Center located at Chester, IL for the past three years. I bring the Holy Eucharist to the men and serve as a Catechist. It is both gratifying and fulfilling, but yet so humbling in bringing Jesus and His Word to these men who are incarcerated. These are men who long to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. They are most grateful the Church has remembered them.

Jesus has told us to visit the imprisoned. Even though humankind has meted their judgment on these men, God's mercy, which is love, prevails to a penitent person at all times regardless of what they have done. To sin is human, but to forgive is divine. Through eyes of faith let us forgive one another, i.e., become more like our God, as Jesus teaches us in the Lord's Prayer.

One day this summer I noticed a butterfly in the kitchen. It was fluttering to every window to try to be free, but to no avail. I approached the butterfly and after several attempts I gently cupped it in my hand. I went outdoors and released it. Through eyes of faith I thought does not our God do the same thing for me; for us? We, His butterflies are trapped, imprisoned in sin. God gently and mercifully reaches, full of compassion, to set us free; as many times as it takes! Blessed be God forever!

What is time? Is it not just the monitoring of the movement of heavenly bodies? Is not a day just the complete rotation of the earth on its axis? Is not a month just the cycled appearance of the moon in the sky? Is not a year just the orbit of the earth around the sun? But yet, people are too bounded, too controlled by time. How many of us think we do not have enough time? One of my favorite songs is called, "Sweet Time". Its lyrics ring true:

SWEET TIME

Refrain:

Beautiful, wonderful promise of man Time without measure in that great land. Give of yourself to others each day. TAKE YOUR SWEET TIME, BUT GIVE IT AWAY!

Life's not a mystery when we look back. Always a plan, always on track! Why do we wonder or worry each day? No need to hurry. Take time away!

Time is our fortune, more precious than gold. It is the key of love that we hold. Give of it freely. It shall be repaid. God promises time, so give it away.

Speak to a stranger, encourage a friend. Smell all the roses that someone sends. Comfort a heart that you could mend. Shop wisely my friend with time to spend.

My fellow cursillistas we all are on our fourth day journey. Mine began 1,655 earth rotations ago but I am still on my fourth day even when the earth has completed another orbit around the sun. Through eyes of faith, let us have Jesus as our axis and our Sun. His Truth will set us free. Let us not be bounded by time to limit our love for our God or our neighbor, since God promises us eternal life. Let us take each moment and make each moment to live in perfect harmony in doing His will. Everything we do must be done For Christ, Through Christ, With Christ, In Christ, Like Christ and for the Love of Christ. In short, everything done For The WILL of Christ!

Sponsor Guidelines

u Speak to God about a person before speaking to a person about God



To be a Sponsor is a privilege, and as such, carries a serious Christian responsibility. Sponsoring a friend for the Cursillo is not a haphazard circumstance. It should be a deliberate act to bring Jesus Christ into the world. Therefore, you must know your candidate and consider the important items below.

GUIDELINES FOR CANDIDATE SELECTION

- ♣ An adult Catholic (18+) who is able to receive the Sacraments and emotionally mature to understand the evangelical message and commit to it
- ♣ Able and willing to influence others in a Christian way
- Be free of unusual stress, e.g., recent loss of a loved one (out of respect for the candidate and in courtesy to other attendees)

CANDIDATE APPLICATION

- Do not be secretive. Answer honestly any questions the candidate has about the weekend or the movement (with the exception of palanca)
- ₱ Explain the Cursillo 4th Day (Group Reunion and Ultreya) to the candidate
- The cost of the weekend is approximately \$175. No one will be turned away because of finances. Inform the precursillo chairperson, in confidence, if your candidate is unable to pay for the weekend in full
- Complete the application with your candidate and mail this completed Sponsor Commitment, the Candidate Application, and a \$50 (non-refundable) deposit to the precursillo chairperson. Note that Candidate Applications cannot be accepted without the submission of the Sponsor Commitment Form.
- Shortly after receipt of the application and Sponsor Commitment Form, the precursillo chairperson will **e-mail** the applicant a confirmation letter with further information about the weekend. You, as the sponsor will receive an e-mail as well. Check with your candidate that they received the e-mail and provide answers to any additional questions.

IN PREPARATION FOR THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

- ◆ Do palanca (pray and sacrifice) for your candidate
- Attend the Novena on Sundays from January 7 through March 4 at 1:00 PM, St. Joseph Freeburg Invite your candidate to attend a group reunion and Ultreya (prior to the weekend)

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

Insure your candidate has transportation to the Ruma Center. Candidates should not drive to the Cursillo site.

- ♣ Continue doing palanca for your candidate and all others attending the weekend
- Write a palanca letter to your candidate (indicate "Sponsor Letter" on the outside of the envelope) and give it to one of the team members prior to the start of the weekend
- Attend the Sunday evening closing and dinner, arriving at Ruma by 4:00 PM. Take your candidate home.

RESPONSIBILITIES FOLLOWING THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

- ☼ Keep in close contact with your candidate, continuing to show as much interest as you did prior to the Cursillo, and encouraging them to persevere in their 4th Day
- ♣ Help your candidate find a sharing group
- ◆ Attend the Cursillo Weekend Reunion with your candidate
- → Accompany your candidate to Ultreya and School of Leaders

Sponsor Commitment Form

Complete the sponsor commitment form and mail with your candidate's completed application and \$50 deposit to Laura Veach, 4 Zinnia Drive, Belleville, IL 62221.

Upon receipt, a letter will be sent to your candidate with information about the weekend. And you will receive a letter with a reminder about a Palanca letter for your candidate, their transportation to and from Ruma, and your support of your candidate beyond the 3-day weekend.

FAQs

Getting Ready for the Weekend

- *Q.* What are the dates for 2018? Will there be other weekends?
- A. Each year in the spring the Belleville Diocese hosts two Cursillo weekends, one for men and one for women. The 2018 Men's Weekend is scheduled March 8th to 11th; Women's Weekend is scheduled March 15th to 18th.
- *Q.* What do I need to bring to the weekend?
- A. Please bring your own personal items such as soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, hairdryer, etc. Towels and bedding are provided. There will be plenty of food, snacks, and drinks as well.
- *Q.* Do I have to share a room and/or bathroom with somebody else?
- A. You will most likely share a sleeping room with another Cursillista. While the bedrooms do not have a private baths, there are plenty of bathrooms available and ample time for showering each morning or evening.
- Q. How should I dress?
- A. Comfortably! Jeans, sweats, tennis shoes, etc. are the norm.
- Q. I can't be there the entire time from Thursday evening until Sunday evening, can I still attend?
- A. Unfortunately no, this is a weekend community and is designed to build from the start on Thursday evening at dinner through Sunday evening dinner. Perhaps your candidate will be available for the Cursillo weekend the following year.
- Q. What is the cost of the weekend?
- A. The cost of the weekend is \$175; candidates are asked to give a \$50 deposit with their application. Please be assured that no one will be excluded from the weekend because the cost is beyond their means. In this case, please talk confidentially to the Precursillo Chairperson.
- *Q.* Why can't I drive myself?
- A. There are several reasons we provide a ride. Of course we don't want you to leave early (which is probably what you have heard), but riding to the weekend with your sponsor or friend provides an opportunity for last minute questions, and simply you don't walk into the weekend alone. And when you leave you will most likely be very anxious to talk about your weekend, and the ride home with your sponsor is a great opportunity.

During the Weekend

- Q. Is Cursillo a retreat?
- A. Cursillo is not a retreat because it can only be made once in a lifetime. The Cursillo weekend is built on community and differs greatly from the individual solitude of a retreat. The word, Cursillo is a Spanish word meaning "little" or "short course" so the Cursillo weekend is "a short course in Christianity."
- Q. What happens during the weekend? What should I expect?
- A. You will listen to talks given by clergy and lay people during which you will take some notes just as you would take notes in a regular classroom. Each talk is followed by a discussion period. You

will also pray together, celebrate the Eucharist and visit the Blessed Sacrament with other Cursillistas. And you will have opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

- Q. Do I have to share about my past?
- A. No, you only share what you want to share.
- Q. Where can I get more information about the Cursillo movement?
- A. There is a lot of information available on the Internet. The Belleville Diocesan Cursillo Website (bellevillecursillo.org) and the National Cursillo Movement (cursillo.org) are two great sources.

After the Weekend

- Q. After the weekend, how much of a time commitment do I have to make?
- A. There is no specific time commitment because you make a Cursillo weekend. Cursillo is not an organization, it is a movement. The Holy Spirit will guide you to what time you feel you want to give. After the weekend some go full board and attend every event Cursillo offers, some go to a few, and some just make the weekend; but regardless, the weekend will change your life.
- Q. What is "4th Day?"
- A. The three-day Cursillo weekend is meant to be a beginning. The "after" activity of the Cursillo weekend is known as the "4th day," i.e., the balance of the Cursillista's life on earth. There are many opportunities through Ultreyas or group reunions to continue the growth in understanding and zeal within the Christian community.

Sponsors

- Q. Where can I get an application, when should I send it, and to whom do I send it?
- A. Applications are available at the Ultreyas, at www.bellevillecursillo.org, at the end of this newsletter, or by contacting the Precursillo Chairperson. Please be sure both the Applicant Form and the Sponsor Information Sheet is complete and mail them (with the deposit) to: Laura Veach, 4 Zinnia Drive, Belleville, IL 62221. The application deadline for the Men's Weekend is March 1st and the application deadline for the Women's Weekend is March 8th.
- Q. What are the responsibilities of the sponsor?
- A. To be a sponsor is a privilege and carries a serious Christian responsibility. It should be a deliberate act to bring your friend to Christ.

The sponsor should pray and sacrifice (Palanca) for their candidate before and during the Cursillo weekend. Sponsors are encouraged to attend the Precursillo Novena held at St. Joseph, Freeburg, each Sunday at 1:00 PM beginning January 7th through March 4th.

For the weekend, it is the sponsor's responsibility to ensure your candidate has transportation to and from the Ruma Center as well as attending the Sunday evening closing and dinner. And finally, sponsors are encouraged to write a letter to their candidate (this can be given to any team member prior to the start of the weekend).

- Q. I don't have anyone to sponsor. How can I be a part of the Cursillo weekend?
- A. Every 4th Day is encouraged to offer Palanca for the team and the candidates, attend the Precursillo Novena held at St. Joseph, Freeburg each Sunday at 1:00 PM beginning January 7th through March 4th and attend the closing and dinner on the Sunday evenings (Men's Weekend March 11th and Women's Weekend March 18th) at Ruma.
