**FROM THE LAY DIRECTOR ROBERT MCCORMACK**

By now, I believe many of our Cursillistas have heard that changes are being made to our Cursillo program in the Belleville Diocese. Some of these changes have been promulgated by the National and Regional Offices and some are changes which we are making at the local Diocesan level.

First, we had a large number of women applicants for the Spring Cursillo Weekend who were unable to attend, so the Secretariat has elected to hold a Cursillo for Women at the King's House in Belleville on October 24-27, 2019. We are currently in the planning stages for that Cursillo. We have also discussed moving the regular Cursillo Weekends to the fall to avoid problems with the Lent and Easter activities of the Church in the spring and possibly to a new location. These changes are still under consideration, so a final decision has not been made.

Second, we have the *Step-by-Step Manual* changes, which will affect our Weekend schedule and the Rollos. We have a team, led by Cheryl Rajski, in the process of methodically going through the changes promulgated to us through the National Cursillo Office and modifying our local program and schedule. These changes will affect the Weekend schedule, the Closing, and the presentation of the Rollos.

Change is a difficult thing to deal with sometimes. I ask everyone to reserve their opinion on these changes until we know exactly how the changes will affect our Cursillo program in the Belleville Dioceses. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we are going forward with a positive attitude to accommodate these changes into our local program.

In response to tremendous interest, **a second Women's Cursillo Weekend in 2019 has been scheduled for October 24 – October 27, 2019, at King's House Retreat Center in Belleville.** Sponsors, if your candidate was unable to make the March 2019 Women's Weekend, you will be contacted to see if they can attend the October weekend. Be aware the response time for this weekend is shorter than usual, so don't delay in talking with your candidates.

Planning is also underway for the 2020 Men's and Women's Cursillo Weekends which may take place in Fall 2020. Be watching for the announcement when dates and venues are confirmed. However, it is not too early to begin the process of “making a friend, being a friend, and bringing that friend to Christ” during these weekends.

Sponsors, please pay special attention to the following points to expedite your candidate's application process:

- Review all paperwork with your candidate for completeness and accuracy **before** submission to the Precursillo chair.
- Submit applications, deposits, and sponsor commitment forms **together as a packet** to the Precursillo chair. The candidate cannot be confirmed until all these items have been received.
- Support your candidates throughout the Precursillo and Cursillo periods.
- Assist your candidates to successfully transition into the Fourth Day.

**Witness by Steve Schaefer**  
**Belleville Cursillo Reunion on April 27, 2019**

Despite a strong Catholic awareness in my youth surrounded by a community of devout Catholics, and twelve years of a Catholic education, I found myself less engaged in my Catholic faith for a good part of my adult life. I was still going through the motions, but spiritually lifeless. Well, you do reap what you sow. By middle age I saw my children leave the faith and most crucially, my wife found spiritual comfort in a nondenominational church. But was it too late? Fortunately the Lord never tires of trying to reach out, so I prayed like I never prayed before. Could He just fix this? He answered my prayers by calling me to Cursillo. Not by a normal route, for I would have never gone on a “retreat” if asked, but through a Protestant retreat my wife made me go to. (Hey, sometimes you do whatever she tells you.) It was here I first heard the term “Cursillo” and the Lord put a calling in my heart to seek out and attend a Cursillo Weekend.

And, so the journey began. Grouping is such an important part of the journey. It keeps you accountable. It keeps you moving forward, because every week you have to verbalize what you’ve done on piety, study, and action. But you also receive inspiration from others as they share their personal growth in the Catholic faith. That first year after my Weekend was one of growth in piety and my knowledge of my faith. But it was more than just head knowledge. It was a time when I really opened my heart to Jesus. It was the first time that I really brought Jesus into my life decisions. It was why I took a less lucrative position at the Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows. I felt called to do it.

Life gets busy however, and even though Cursillo had brought me to a good place, after about a year I dropped out of Cursillo (Hey, my road to Jesus isn’t always a straight line). Still lingering in my heart, however, were members of my family that had fallen away from the Church. I can remember stopping by a statue of Our Lady of the Snows and from the depths of my soul asking for her aid in fixing this. Less than two hours later ... out of the blue ... I was asked to be on the Cursillo team. Seems to be a pattern here: I pray, and Jesus leads me to Cursillo.

What a rejuvenating experience to be on a team. I re-engaged in my Cursillo journey, but now focusing not just on piety and study but on apostolic action. There is a wealth of experience in grouping by listening and learning. I learned how others have reached out to people in their lives. Not only do you pick up techniques, but grouping builds up your confidence to reach out.

In the end, it comes down to “Make a friend, Be a friend, and Bring that friend to Christ.” Engage in a common interest, watch for opportunities that the Lord will provide, plant seeds without being overbearing, be persistent and patient, and pray like you never prayed before. The Holy Spirit will do the rest. It might be winter camping with your son that will give opportunities. It might be weekly short visits in adoration followed by lunch with your daughter that opens the door. Sometimes it involves fixing yourself as an example of the love of Christ before He can fix a marriage. It doesn’t happen overnight. Be patient. It took twelve years of being on the Cursillo journey to fix the things I had messed up, but my son, daughter, and wife have all returned to the Catholic faith, made their Cursillo weekends and are going strong on the journey. Thanks be to God!

Journey with us, my brothers and sisters. Cursillo is your opportunity to make a difference. Don't miss it. We are losing souls out there every day. Some of them are people you love. Christ is counting on you!

## *Sponsor Guidelines*



Speak to God about a person before speaking to a person about God



To be a Sponsor is a privilege, and as such, carries a serious Christian responsibility. Sponsoring a friend for the Cursillo is not a haphazard circumstance. It should be a deliberate act to bring Jesus Christ into the world. Therefore, you must know your candidate and consider the important items below.

### GUIDELINES FOR CANDIDATE SELECTION

- ✠ An adult Catholic (18+) who is able to receive the Sacraments and emotionally mature to understand the evangelical message and commit to it
- ✠ Able and willing to influence others in a Christian way
- ✠ Be free of unusual stress, e.g., recent loss of a loved one (out of respect for the candidate and in courtesy to other attendees)

### CANDIDATE APPLICATION

- ✠ Do not be secretive. Answer honestly any questions the candidate has about the weekend or the movement (with the exception of palanca)
- ✠ Explain the Cursillo 4<sup>th</sup> Day (Group Reunion and Ultreya) to the candidate
- ✠ The cost of the weekend is approximately \$225-\$250. No one will be turned away because of finances. Inform the Precursillo chairperson, in confidence, if your candidate is unable to pay for the weekend in full
- ✠ Complete the application with your candidate and mail this completed Sponsor Commitment, the Candidate Application, and a \$50 (non-refundable) deposit to the Precursillo chairperson. Note that Candidate Applications cannot be accepted without the submission of the Sponsor Commitment Form.
- ✠ Shortly after receipt of the application and Sponsor Commitment Form, the Precursillo chairperson will **e-mail** the applicant a confirmation letter with further information about the weekend. You, as the sponsor will receive an e-mail as well. Check with your candidate that they received the e-mail and provide answers to any additional questions.

### IN PREPARATION FOR THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

- ✠ Do palanca (pray and sacrifice) for your candidate
- ✠ Attend the Novena on the dates/time announced at St. Joseph Freeburg ✠ Invite your candidate to attend a group reunion and Ultreya (prior to the weekend)

### THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

- ✠ Insure your candidate has transportation to the King's House in Belleville. Candidates should not drive to the Cursillo site.
- ✠ Continue doing palanca for your candidate and all others attending the weekend
- ✠ Write a palanca letter to your candidate (indicate "Sponsor Letter" on the outside of the envelope) and give it to one of the team members prior to the start of the weekend
- ✠ Attend the Sunday evening closing and dinner as announced. Take your candidate home.

### RESPONSIBILITIES FOLLOWING THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

- ✠ Keep in close contact with your candidate, continuing to show as much interest as you did prior to the Cursillo, and encouraging them to persevere in their 4<sup>th</sup> Day
- ✠ Help your candidate find a sharing group
- ✠ Attend the Cursillo Weekend Reunion with your candidate
- ✠ Accompany your candidate to Ultreya and School of Leaders

## *Sponsor Commitment Form*

Complete the sponsor commitment form and mail with your candidate's completed application and \$50 deposit to Laura Veach, 4 Zinnia Drive, Belleville, IL 62221.

Upon receipt, a letter will be sent to your candidate with information about the weekend. And you will receive a letter with a reminder about a Palanca letter for your candidate, their transportation to and from King's House, and your support of your candidate beyond the 3-day weekend.

Note that Candidate Applications cannot be accepted without the submission of the Sponsor Commitment Form.
