FROM THE LAY DIRECTOR ROBERT MCCORMACK

In the last Evangelizer, I mentioned new guidance being downward directed to the Cursillo Movement by Eduardo Bonin and his staff in Mallorca. These updates are aimed at aligning the US Cursillo with the original Cursillo concepts put in place 50 years ago, which was to bring people closer to God through mutual support and friendship. We appreciate how this strikes a sensitive cord with many of us who are very passionate about Cursillo. We have had long and thoughtful conversations in the School of Leaders and Secretariat meetings concerning how to handle these issues. Some parts of the Weekend have been deemphasized or eliminated in favor of increased time or emphasis on other parts. For example, we will no longer have a Cursillo theme and poster. Cursillo is the theme and the poster is the same picture of Jesus that is in the office of Eduardo Bonin. The Weekend will now allow more time for spiritual direction and reflection. Plans to meet and know candidates prior to the Cursillo will be made. Candidates will become Cursillistas and receive their crosses earlier in the Weekend to emphasize that we are all Cursillistas and one body in Christ. Cheryl Rajski, the Rectora for the next Women's Cursillo, which will be held October 24-27, 2019, at the King's House, has been leading the effort to identify the new Step-by-Step procedures and how to include them in the Cursillo Weekend Schedule and activities.

At the local level, we are in the process of moving the Weekends from the spring to the fall. Relocation to the fall was made because support from priests and deacons during Lent and Easter has been increasingly difficult. This move has received strong support by nearly everyone. As a part of the change in season, we also have considered a change in venue from ASC Ruma to the King's House. We currently have Cursillos scheduled at both the King's House and at ASC Ruma for the fall of 2020. Terry Kostel, the Three-Day Chair, and I have had some very positive discussions with the ASC Leadership in Ruma about hosting our Cursillos. They have offered some good suggestions on how we can better use their facilities. In addition, the feedback from the Women's Cursillo, which will be held at the King's House this October, will help to finalize the decision on location. The Cursillo Weekend venue is still an open issue that will require further discussion.

I ask the entire Cursillo community to keep an open mind. The road ahead has been well thought out and approached with caution and should have a positive effect on our Cursillo program in the future.

- Stay in contact with your friend throughout their Fourth Day journey.

POSTCURSILLO JOHN AND BERNADETTE CHARLTON



We had a wonderful Day of Recollection on September 22 at Saint Peter's Cathedral in Belleville as we celebrated the 75th Anniversary of the Cursillo Movement. Special thanks to our musicians for leading our songs of praise and thanksgiving. Our focus was on the Spiritual Testimony of our founder, Eduardo Bonnin and aligning our Belleville Cursillo with the original Cursillo in Mallorca, Spain. Four rollos were presented: Precursillo, Cursillo, and Postcursillo (the three parts of the Stepby-Step process), and Foundational Charism of the Cursillo Movement.

Foundational Charism of the Cursillo Movement: A charism is a spiritual gift or talent granted by God to the recipient not primarily for his own sake but for the benefit of others "in order to perfect the saints for a work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ." The recipient of the Cursillo charism was Eduardo Bonnin. Cursillo has been officially recognized as a Catholic Movement. (Movements in the Catholic Church are groups of church members following a specific spirituality given to them by their founders.) 1n 1998, Saint Pope John Paul II invited all Movements to return to their roots and discern the mentality of their founders. US. Cursillo has been working on "returning to our roots" for the past 20 years, culminating in the publishing of the spiritual testimony of Eduardo Bonnin's Stepby-Step documentation of the Cursillo Movement.

Precursillo: The Cursillo in Christianity Movement is based upon <u>friendship</u>. Cursillo is a witness of Christ offering His friendship. Everything that we are called to be in Cursillo is through friendship with others. When speaking of Precursillo, we initially think of those people who can, who should, or who should not live the experience of Cursillo. The first point of reflection in Precursillo needs to be directed to sponsors: those Cursillistas who invite others to live the Cursillo experience. Equally important is the group of leaders who will serve in the Cursillo. The witness of the sponsors and the leaders who organize the Cursillo are extremely important in the Precursillo. The witness of those who invite, and the work of the leaders are like that of the sower. The sower prepares the ground and takes care of the seed. The seed will produce fruit if it falls on fertile ground. This work of the sower is of crucial importance. There is a renewed emphasis on sponsors and their critical role in Cursillo.

Three-Day Cursillo: There will be a few changes in how we execute the actual weekend. But it's worth noting that most of the things that we have done in the past will stay the same. For example, there are still 15 rollos...but there are a few minor differences within a few of them. Perhaps the most

significant update to the weekend is a simplified schedule. Giving new Cursillistas more freedom and more time to reflect is being emphasized. Closing has also been adapted a bit. Our Rectora for our next Women's Weekend in October, Cheryl Rajski, has spent months pouring over this new guide and preparing the way for this event.

Postcursillo: Postcursillo is meant to continue the process begun during the Cursillo ... that of being converted and living out what is fundamental for being a Christian. We are to renew, accelerate and continue our conversion, and consequently provide a continuous transformation of the environments of our lives. Two specific tools were developed to ensure the success of Postcursillo: Group Reunion and Ultreya. Group Reunion is a continuation of one's living and sharing the love of God and neighbor through friendship. Cursillos are made so that there will be people who can make Group Reunions. Sponsors are responsible for placing new Cursillistas in Group Reunions where the tripod of piety, study and action are carried out.

It is great to sponsor and bring people to the Weekend, but if we don't continue the friendship after the Weekend, we leave them high and dry and their environments may remain unchanged. Pope Francis in his book, "Joy of the Gospel," encourages us to express our energy and joy when we evangelize in order to bring others to the Joy of the Gospel. Pope Francis reinforces the path of friendship, "this ardent desire for friendship with God" and tells us "it is about going out, but without fatigue, towards extending the relations of friendship, which can result in evangelizing the faraway."

There will be two very special Fourth Day events on Sunday, October 27:

Mañanitas

Las Mañanitas is a Spanish folk song. In the Cursillo tradition, it is sung as an early morning serenade to the new cursillistas on the last day of the Cursillo. Mañanitas has been an essential part of Cursillo for over fifty years and is being reintroduced to the US Cursillo Movement. This is a wonderful form of Palanca from our Fourth Day to our newest Cursillistas, providing an experience that most new Cursillistas will remember forever. Our Fourth Day community will gather in the parking lot at the King's House at 7:10 a.m. on Sunday morning and will process to the chapel while singing. Music will be provided. Please come dressed in bright, Cursillo colors!

Sponsor Guidelines



Speak to God about a person before speaking to a person about God



To be a Sponsor is a privilege, and as such, carries a serious Christian responsibility. Sponsoring a friend for the Cursillo is not a haphazard circumstance. It should be a deliberate act to bring Jesus Christ into the world. Therefore, you must know your candidate and consider the important items below.

GUIDELINES FOR CANDIDATE SELECTION

- ♣ An adult Catholic (18+) who is able to receive the Sacraments and emotionally mature to understand the evangelical message and commit to it
- ♣ Able and willing to influence others in a Christian way
- 母 Be free of unusual stress, e.g., recent loss of a loved one (out of respect for the candidate and in courtesy to other attendees)

CANDIDATE APPLICATION

- ⊕ Do not be secretive. Answer honestly any questions the candidate has about the weekend or the movement (with the exception of palanca)
- ⊕ Explain the Cursillo 4th Day (Group Reunion and Ultreya) to the candidate
- The cost of the weekend is \$225. No one will be turned away because of finances. Inform the Precursillo chairperson, in confidence, if your candidate is unable to pay for the weekend in full
- © Complete the application with your candidate and mail this completed Sponsor Commitment, the Candidate Application, and a \$50 (non-refundable) deposit to the Precursillo chairperson. Note that Candidate Applications cannot be accepted without the submission of the Sponsor Commitment Form.
- ☼ Shortly after receipt of the application and Sponsor Commitment Form, the Precursillo chairperson will e-mail the applicant a confirmation letter with further information about the weekend. You, as the sponsor will receive an e-mail as well. Check with your candidate that they received the e-mail and provide answers to any additional questions.

IN PREPARATION FOR THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

- ♣ Do palanca (pray and sacrifice) for your candidate
- ♣ Attend the Novena on the dates/time announced at St. Joseph Freeburg ♣ Invite your candidate to attend a group reunion and Ultreya (prior to the weekend)

THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

- Insure your candidate has transportation to the King's House in Belleville. Candidates should not drive to the Cursillo site.
- Continue doing palanca for your candidate and all others attending the weekend
- Write a palanca letter to your candidate (indicate "Sponsor Letter" on the outside of the envelope) and give it to one of the team members prior to the start of the weekend
- 4 Attend the Sunday evening closing and dinner as announced. Take your candidate home.

RESPONSIBILITIES FOLLOWING THE CURSILLO WEEKEND

- ★ Keep in close contact with your candidate, continuing to show as much interest as you did prior to the Cursillo, and encouraging them to persevere in their 4th Day
- Help your candidate find a sharing group
- → Attend the Cursillo Weekend Reunion with your candidate
- ♣ Accompany your candidate to Ultreya and School of Leaders

Complete the sponsor commitment form and mail with your candidate's completed application and \$50 deposit to Laura Veach, 4 Zinnia Drive, Belleville, IL 62221.

Upon receipt, a letter will be sent to your candidate with information about the weekend. And you will receive a letter with a reminder about a Palanca letter for your candidate, their transportation to and from King's House, and your support of your candidate beyond the 3-day weekend.
